The routine includes: previewing, activities for teaching word relationships, selecting academic words to teach in-depth, using context and word parts, and promoting word consciousness. Appropriate for gr K-12.</p>	<p>Teachers learn how to plan and conduct a close reading lesson. Topics include characteristics of a close reading lesson, preparing a complex text passage, generating text-dependent questions, and providing explicit instruction through modeling and think aloud. Appropriate for gr 2-12.</p>	<p>Instructional practices for teaching writing in all subject areas for a variety of academic tasks, audiences, and purposes, using the 3 types of writing. Teachers prepare students by practicing this routine using classroom content: (A) Analyze Prompt, (N) Set Notes, (S) Select Information, (W) Write, (ER) Edit and Revise. 
